SOUTH BUCKINGHAMSHIRE:

Burglaries:

- Beaconsfield, Iver & Chalfont St Peter- offenders gaining entry through upstairs windows
- **Burnham** Purses, electronics and keys stolen. Entry through insecure doors
- **Shoplifting Offences** are on the rise. We are working with high street businesses in high Wycombe to help combat this issues.
- Theft of personal belongings from vehicles is on the rise High Wycombe, Chesham, Ivers, Wexham, Stoke Poges are currently the worse effected areas.
- **ASB**-6 Closure Orders in place for a period of 3 months working in conjunction with Bucks Council and other partners for longer term solutions to solve.
- **Robbery-**3 x Personal robberies unlinked in the last 3 weeks. One suspect charged and remanded.





AYLESBURY

- Shoplifting Offences are on the rise. We are working with high street businesses in Aylesbury to help combat this issues.
- Anti-Social Behaviour
 - 3 Closure Orders in place for a period of 3 months working in conjunction with Bucks Council and other partners for longer term solutions to solve.
 - Reported ASB concerns around McDonalds in Aylesbury Town Centre. Aylesbury Neighbourhood Team now own to adopt for disruption measures.
- **Robbery**-No Robberies of personal property offences. However 3x business robberies within commercial premises. Suspect has been arrested, charged and remanded.





BURGLARY CRIME PREVENTION

Crime Prevention Advice

Often burglaries are committed by opportunist thieves. Some simple measures can help prevent you becoming a victim of crime:

- Make sure front doors are closed even when you are at home.
- Remember to lock all doors and close windows both at night and when you go out.
- Keep ladders and tools stored away when not in use or padlock them so they cannot be used for crime.
- Keep small valuables e.g purses, tablets, playstations out of sight of open doors and windows, to prevent opportunist thieves spotting them.
- Store bins out of sight and away from any walls fences and your property so they cannot be used to gain access to your property.

VEHICLE CRIME PREVENTION ADVICE

Crime Prevention Advice

- Staff are advised to ensure personal belongings are kept in a safe place, preferably in staff access only areas.
- Keep mobile phones out of sight and/or safely on your person at all times.
- Security mark property and register the make, model and serial number for free with <u>Immobilise</u>

TVP are working with partner agencies to extend the 3-month Partial Premises Closure Order on Dovecot and Sainsbury's car parks in High Wycombe



As of 24th September 2024, it will be against the law to own a zombie style knife or machete.

A surrender scheme has been run up to 23rd September 2024.

These knives can be handed in to police stations or anonymously via amnesty bins.
